

Overview of the Land Services
Commercialisation Transaction and Scope







On 13 October 2017 Land Services SA (LSSA) was established as the exclusive Service Provider to the South Australian Government for a range of transactional land services and property valuation services previously delivered through the Lands Titles Office.

The Registrar-General remained within Government and undertakes a regulatory role by ensuring LSSA meets the contractual requirements of the Land Services Agreement (LSA).







The Government undertook key protections for the public of South Australia including:

- the Government continuing to guarantee indefeasibility of property title
- no change to Torrens Title or other legal status of land
- the Government retaining key legal, policy and regulatory functions and responsibilities
- the Government continuing to set regulated fees and charges (no changes other than standard annual increases)
- the Government retaining ownership of titling and valuation data and associated intellectual property
- stringent service delivery standards, data security and privacy protections
- maintaining existing access arrangements, including the Adelaide office of the LTO and over-the-counter services.






Land Information Services

- Examining plan to ensure it meets cadastral plan requirements, PPG standard, legislative requirements, and survey definition
- Monthly reported Service Level Requirements and Quality measures to the State

- Advice to the General Public on land sub-division, fencing and boundary enquiries etc.

Registrar-General






- The Registrar-General is a statutory position under the Real Property Act 1886 and the Registration of Deeds Act 1935 and the Registrar-General is responsible for the administration of the Acts
- The Registrar-General under the Electronic Conveyancing National Law (South Australia) Act 2013 (ECNL) approves and regulates SA operating Electronic Lodgement Network Operators (ELNOs), currently PEXA and Sympli
- The Registrar-General is a member of the Australian Registrars' National Electronic Conveyancing Council (ARNECC)
- · A key focus is electronic conveyancing in South Australia

Contract & Compliance



- Responsible for the management and oversight of the contractual relationship between the State and the Land Services SA for the provision of land titling services and valuation services
- Under the contract Land Services SA is required to obtain approval from the State to introduce certain changes
- Land Services SA are also obliged to report any critical errors made by Land Services SA to the Registrar-General to seek direction as to next steps
- Audits of Land Services SA to determine compliance and performance
- Financial functions under the contract





Legislation and Policy

- Assist LSSA with complex land titling matters
- •Review and provide expert advice on proposed legislative reforms by other government areas related to land titling
- Technical expertise sought regularly by other government departments
- Non-delegated matters (Real Property Act 1886 and other legislation):
 - Assurance Fund Claims under Part 18
 - Section 146 discharge recommendations to the Minister
 - Approval of LTO form requirements
- Regulating fees for products and lodgements
- Directing the progression of electronic lodgement of dealings in South Australia
- Liaising with LSSA, Industry and ELNOs on conveyancing matters
- Electronic conveyancing national working groups



ICT & Innovation



- Oversight of the measures applied to protect the State's information assets (SAILIS) and ensure compliance with standards including the SA Cyber Security Framework
- Managing ICT incidents, and problems related to the land information systems and any state systems that have integration with SAILIS, EPL, and View
- ICT and Cybersecurity internal and external audit of Land Services SA
- Providing advice on contract approvals as it relates to ICT
- Analysis, documentation and facilitation of government requests for bulk and custom land titling datasets
- Managing State initiated system enhancements, and change requests related to SAILIS, EPL, and View
- Annual fees and charges change process
- Updating the SAILIS Form 1 and Property Interest Report template
- Provision of support to SAILIS user agencies with the maintenance of Property Interests and Administrative Interests
